

BEN WOOD

Ben is a children's book illustrator based in Melbourne, Australia. Ben has illustrated picture books, junior fiction and non-fiction titles. He has worked with top publishers such as Hardie Grant Children's Publishing, Scholastic and Penguin Random House. Ben's work has had notable listings for the Children Book Council Australia, been shortlisted for Readings Children's Book Prize, and shortlisted for the Australian Book Industry Awards in 2019 and 2020.

Best known as the co-creator of the bestselling series **REAL PIGEONS** by **Andrew McDonald**, the series is published in 23 languages and sold in 24 territories. A film and TV series is also in development with **Nickelodeon** and **Fulwell 73 Productions**.

'After the Fall' and 'The Calm Workbook.'

'After the Fall' is the story of how Humpty Dumpty had a fear of heights after he fell off the wall. All the King's Men helped put his body back together again but it takes time for his mental health.


The Calm Workbook is about learning how to chill out and power down which is very important for our Mental Health. Our brains have a lot to do and need some training. At times our brain needs to focus other times we need to ease the emotions and soothe the worries and we cannot forget to rest our brain.



This book helps to center yourself before you react. It contains Creative and easy-to-follow activities and top tips, such as

- Settling your anxious thoughts in your head with a glitter shaker
- Letting go of your worries with mindful breathing and a listening game
- Allowing your thoughts to wander on a rainbow walk
- Making your own fidget tool

This book has been peer reviewed by a child psychologist, who has left notes throughout just incase your child has questions about the activities.





The ICT levy will continue in 2024 for our students in Grade 3 and Grade 4, as higher grades will still be part of the previous BYOD Program.

In 2025 the levy will be extended to Grades 3, Grades 4 and Grades 5.

If your family is eligible for the Reduced Fees Policy and you have been approved through the formal approval process, then the ICT levy will be included in the discount fees offered.


